<p>Are you currently experiencing any of the following symptoms?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> unpleasant smelling discharge unusual coloured or blood-stained discharge blisters or sores abnormal bleeding lower abdominal pain fever or chills 	<p>Patient selected NO to experiencing these symptoms (not symptom of thrush)</p>
<p>Have you had thrush more than 3 times in the past 6 months or Was your previous thrush treatment unsuccessful?</p>	<p>Patient selected NO - they have not experienced thrush > 3 times in past 6 months or previous unsuccessful treatment</p>
<p>Are you pregnant (or think you might be) or breastfeeding?</p>	<p>Patient selected NO - Not pregnant (or aware of) or breastfeeding</p>
<p>Do you prefer a One Day, 3 Day or 6 day treatment?</p>	<p>Prefer one day treatment option</p>
